Director Finley introduced the newly hired office staff personnel and park rangers to the Commission.

#### San Bruno Mountain Watch - Kris Jensen, Executive Director

Mr. Kris Jensen, Executive Director, San Bruno Mountain Watch, provided a short presentation on their evolving organization noting their continuing partnership with the County. He noted they would be redefining their education programs for a future launch and putting a moratorium on their current education programs until then. He reported on their native plant nursery efforts, their strong hiking programs, and their goal to

Marlene Finley, Director Brenda Bennett, Executive Secretary acquire more land on the Mountain. He thanked the County for acquiring the sand dune lots in Daly City.

#### Student Conservation Association Summer Crew Activities

Ms. Rachelle Hedges, SCA GIS Intern, thanked the student crew for their hard work in County Parks. SCA summer crew members Mason Saia, Jason Romero, Mayra Yepez, Stephanie Rojas, Carmen Vescia, Daniel Pedreiro, and their crew leaders Julian Mireles and Jaden Wilkes collected data at five San Mateo County parks, an area of 5,282 acres and captured data for 870 drainages, 71 intersections, 200 trail signs, 300 trail maintenance needs, 14 trailheads, 55 miles of trails (about 10 miles of these were unmarked or social trails), 156 other data points (viewpoints, points of interest, bees, nests, etc.), and beta-tested a vegetation monitoring GIS application. The students provided the Commission with a lively and interesting Powerpoint presentation on their summer work achievements.

## Green Valley Trail Project Update – Cecily Harris, Development Consultant

Ms. Harris introduced Ms. Margaret Henderson with Questa Engineering. Ms. Henderson provided the Commission with an update on the Green Valley Trail Project. A plan sheet "Site Overview" was provided to the Commission and copies were made available for the public. In response to inquiry from the Commission, Ms. Harris indicated that the plans and specifications were at 60% and the expectation was to have 100% plans and specifications sometime in December 2015.

## Director's Report

Director Finley reported on the recent red flag condition imposed by Calfire that required parks be closed until it was lifted. She said that Chaparral Country Corporation was the new Folger Stable concessionaire and in addition to boarding services would offer public trail rides and riding lessons. She said a 54-inch SFPUC water line broke at Junipero Serra Park and the park would be closed in late September and October for replacement/repairs to be made. She said that a new portion of the Crystal Springs

Regional Trail, south of dam, would open one weekend each month for users. She also noted that Granada Community Services District had formed a Citizens Recreation and Park Advisory Committee, and the Board of Supervisors approved a Measure A funding agreement with the Pacifica Land Trust for the Pedro Point Headlands.
